## <u>Votes of the State Senate Members of the Joint Finance Committee in Regard to Right-to-Life Issues in the State Budget (AB 40).</u>

Key right-to life votes regarding the State Budget occurred in the Joint Finance Committee. When the Committee finished its work in deciding which items would be contained in the State Budget, the entire budget was debated and voted on by each house of the state legislature. Both of the following amendments became part of the State Budget which s now 2011 Wisconsin Act 32. These votes apply only to those State Senators who are members of the Joint Finance Committee

Vote # 1 - May 18, 2011: Budget provision to insure that \$1 million dollars under the Title V Program would be given only to entities that do not perform or refer for abortions. Voted on byJoint Finance Committee members only. Passed by a vote of 12-4. Wisconsin Right to Life position prevailed.

Vote # 2 - June 3, 2011: Budget provision to prevent the University of Wisconsin from paying medical students to learn to perform abortions and to prohibit UW from using its facilities to perform abortions. Voted on by Joint Finance Committee members only. Passed by a vote of 12-4. Wisconsin Right to Life position prevailed.

## Opt-Out of Abortion Coverage in Health Care Exchanges Created by Obamacare (SB 92/AB 154).

The federal Patient Protection and Affordable Act (PPACA), also known as Obamacare, requires states to operate and maintain "health insurance exchanges" through which health care plans are sold. Participating plans are eligible to receive federal subsidies (taxpayer dollars) for those who qualify for insurance under the exchanges. The PPACA allows states to prohibit coverage of abortions under the qualified health plans offered through the exchanges. Under Senate Bill 92, a qualified health plan that is offered through any exchange operating in the State of Wisconsin may not cover any abortion whose performance is ineligible for funding under current Wisconsin law, s. 20.297. Wisconsin Right to Life strongly supported SB 92. Assembly Bill 154 was the companion bill to SB 92. Senate Bill 92 was the version passed by both houses of the state legislature and signed into law by Governor Walker on April 6. 2012. It is now 2011 Wisconsin Act 218.

Vote # 3 - June 16, 2011: Vote in the Senate Committee on Public Health, Human Services, and Revenue on passage of SB 92. The committee voted to recommend passage of SB 92 by a vote of 3-2. Wisconsin Right to Life position prevailed.

Vote # 4 - October 20, 2011: Vote in State Senate on passage of SB 92. Passed by a vote of 17-16. Wisconsin Right to Life position prevailed.

### Coercive and Webcam Abortion Prevention Act (SB 306/AB 371).

Legislation to protect women from being coerced into having abortions and to prevent Planned Parenthood from bringing webcam abortions to Wisconsin. Although there was an Assembly companion bill (AB 371), both houses of the legislature chose to work exclusively with the State Senate version (SB 306). Signed into law by Governor Walker on April 5, 2012. It is now 2011 Wisconsin Act 217

Vote # 5 - December 13, 2011: Vote in the Senate Committee on Health on whether to recommend SB 306 for passage. Committee recommended passage of SB 306 on a vote of 3-2. Wisconsin Right to Life position prevailed.

Vote # 6 - February 21, 2012: Vote in the State Senate on whether to table Senate Amendment 1 to SB 306 which would have removed penalties for violating the law. Senate voted to table the amendment on a vote of 17-16. Wisconsin Right to Life position prevailed.

Vote # 7 - February 21, 2012: Vote in the State Senate on whether to table Senate Amendment 2 to SB 306 which would have removed important protections for a woman in determining whether her abortion is voluntary and not coerced. Senate voted to table the amendment on a vote of 17-16. Wisconsin Right to Life position prevailed.

Vote # 8 - February 22, 2012: Vote in State Senate on passage of SB 306. Passed by a vote of 17-15. Wisconsin Right to Life position prevailed.

### Strong Communities - Healthy Kids Act (SB 237).

Legislation to return sex-education programs to local control to allow abstinence-only programs. Passed by both houses of the legislature and signed into law by Governor Walker on April 5, 2012. It is now 2011 Wisconsin Act 216.

Vote # 9 - Vote in State Senate on passage of SB 237. Passed by a vote of 17-15. Wisconsin Right to Life position prevailed.

Vote # 8 - March 15, 2012: Vote in the Assembly on whether to table Assembly Amendment 9 to SB 306 which would have had the effect of removing penalties for violating the law. Assembly voted to table the amendment on a vote of 60-33. Wisconsin Right to Life position prevailed.

Vote # 9 - March 15, 2012: Vote in the Assembly on whether to table Assembly Amendment 10 to SB 306 which would have eliminated the requirement for an important follow-up medical evaluation after a woman takes a dangerous abortion-inducing drug. Assembly voted to table the amendment on a vote of 60-33. Wisconsin Right to Life position prevailed.

Vote # 10- March 15, 2012: Vote in the Assembly on whether to table Assembly Amendment 11 to SB 306 which would have changed the definition of abortion in a manner that could eliminate abortion-inducing drugs from the definition. Assembly voted to table the amendment on a vote of 59-34. Wisconsin Right to Life position prevailed.

Vote # 11 - March 15, 2012: Vote in the Assembly on whether to table Assembly Amendment 13 to SB 306 which would have repealed Wisconsin's criminal abortion statute (s. 940.04). Assembly voted to table the amendment on a vote of 60-33. Wisconsin Right to Life position prevailed.

Vote # 12 - March 15, 2012: Assembly vote to concur in State Senate passage of SB 306. The Assembly voted to concur on a vote of 60-33. A vote of concurrence is tantamount to a vote for passage. Wisconsin Right to Life position prevailed.

### Strong Communities - Healthy Kids Act (SB 237)

Legislation to return sex-education programs to local control to allow abstinenceonly programs. Passed by both houses of the legislature and signed into law by Governor Walker on April 5, 2012. It is now 2011 Wisconsin Act 216.

Vote # 13 - March 13, 2012: Assembly voted to concur in State Senate passage of SB 237. Assembly voted to concur on a vote of 60-34. A vote of concurrence is tantamount to a vote for passage. Wisconsin Right to Life position prevailed.
